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In association with Premier, Better Financial Recruitment, CIMA (the Chartered Institute of Management Accountants) sent a salary and benefits questionnaire to all its members including students, in the Republic of Ireland. A total of 1010 responses were received and compiled in November 2004. All results are based solely on information provided by the respondents.

Main findings, commentary & analysis

- · The average remuneration package for Chartered Management Accountants in Ireland in November 2004 is €87,100. This figure represents a 11.9% increase over the figure reported in October 2002.
- · Consistently the highest salaries are being paid in Dublin, with members receiving an average package of €91,000, compared to a low of €66,746 in the West of Ireland.
- · The Telecommunications Sector is the highest paying industry sector with an average package for members of €116,992. This is closely followed by Financial Services where members receive on average €108,010. The Public Sector was identified as the lowest paying sector with an average remuneration package of €67,917.
- · Using number of employees as a guideline to company size, Chartered Management accountants in larger companies are paid more on average than their peers in smaller companies.
- · Gender still continues to be a factor influencing salaries with men still earning more than their female counterparts.
- · Over 37% of respondents received formal training in the last 12 months. An average of 34.5 hours per annum training was received. Most frequently the areas covered include Systems, Accounting Procedures/Standards, Management Skills and Time Management.
- · A majority of 62.6% believe ongoing training to be relevant/very relevant; while 26.8% felt ongoing training was important.
- Autonomy/Influence have been identified as the key motivating factors at FD/FC level. At a middle management level, recognition and career advancement were highlighted. At a junior level, salary and career advancement were identified.
- · 80.8% of all respondents have received a 3rd level qualification. 89.2% of those currently studying received study leave, at an average of 4.5 days per respondent. 32% of students who responded received day release.
- 15.9% of all respondents have changed jobs in the last 12 months, 55.2% engaged a recruitment company to source their new employment.
- Predictions for the year ahead are promising with 61.4% of respondents believing their company turnover will increase and 58.3% expecting an increase in profits.
- The majority (87.3%) of respondents would recommend Accountancy as a professional career, believing it to be rewarding, challenging, and well recognised with definite career progression.
